DID YOU KNOW? BENEFITS OF GARDENING

As nature comes into bloom, the warmer weather is drawing us outdoors. Cultivating a garden is a great activity for seniors in spring and summer. It's fun, purposeful and even provides numerous health benefits.

Gardening can lower levels of cortisol which can alleviate stress and even reduce high blood pressure. Also, being out in the sunlight and creating a beautiful space to rest and relax will bring peace and a reduction in anxiety. (Don't' forget your sunscreen!) Gardening is a moderating intense exercise and can count towards the expert recommended 30 minutes of exercise daily. Additionally, being outside in a sunny garden can increase vitamin D levels, which has also been show to reduce the risk of heart disease.



In addition to being a great form of physical exercise, garden can increase mobility and strength. Keeping lesser used muscles engaged, gardening has been shown to be a productive way of rebuilding strength and mobility following a stroke.

Gardening is one such lifestyle choice that may reduce the risk of Alzheimer's and related forms of dementia. Engaging critical functions like dexterity, problem-solving, endurance and sensory awareness, studies have found that gardening can reduce the risk of dementia by as much as 36%.

You can join the UMSSC Garden Group. They plant and maintain the raised beds out on the patio and would love to see more of our members helping out.
