



DEER ON THE ROAD - WHAT TO DO

Be extra safe out there when you are driving. Did

you know that in Pennsylvania, 1 out of 63 drivers will have a collision with a deer? We are in the top 3 states nationwide for crashing into a large



animal. While most of these accidents take place in November during prime mating and hunting season, the risk for hitting a deer remains high from September through February when deer are migrating and wander all over - and onto - the roads. When you factor in the end of daylight savings time and more vehicles on the road during the deer's most active times of day, close encounters of the deer kind become more probable.

A run-in with a deer can be a very unfortunate event with severe injuries to you and your passengers, not to mention expensive repairs to your vehicle. Here are some simple tips to avoid and minimize damage from a collision with a deer.



1. Watch Your Speed

Slow down when passing yellow animal-crossing signs. These warnings are posted not because

road crews just happen to have a surplus of

signs, but because heavy animal traffic frequents the area.



2. Use High-Beam Headlights

If it's nighttime and there's no oncoming traffic, turn your brights on. Not only will you be able to see better, but the light will illuminate the

deer's reflective eyes.

3. Stay Alert



Keep your eyes on and around the road - especially in deer-crossing zones. Pay attention to road shoulders. Look for reflecting eyes and

remember deer don't travel alone. If you see one, there are most likely others nearby.

4. Take Extra Caution at Dawn and Dusk



Sunrise and sunset are the riskiest times of day for deer collisions. Be more cautious when driving during these hours.

5. Honk Your Horn



Many items, like deer whistles, are sold to prevent collisions, but there hasn't been any proof that they actually repel deer. Ditch the whistle and lay on your horn to scare a deer.

6. Assume Nothing



Be careful and pay attention - deer do unpredictable things. Sometimes they stop in the middle of the road when crossing. Sometimes they cross and

quickly re-cross back from where they came. Sometimes they move toward an approaching vehicle. Assume nothing. Slow down, blow your horn to urge the deer to leave the road. Stop if the deer stays on the road, don't try to go around it.

7. Don't Swerve

Your first instinct may be to swerve don't. Brake firmly and stay in your lane. There may be more serious consequences if you hit another vehicle or a stationary object like a tree.

DID YOU KNOW? - CHRISTMAS TRIVA

WASHINGTON IRVING CREATED MANY SANTA LEGENDS. Washington Irving, best known for The Legend of Sleepy Hollow and his headless horseman, also wrote a lot about St. Nicholas, too. In fact, he was the first to imagine Santa Claus and his eight tiny reindeer. He so loved Santa Claus that in 1835, he helped found the Saint Nicholas Society of the City of New York, serving as its secretary until 1841.

ST. NICK WAS MORE GENEROUS THAN JOLLY. You probably already knew that the idea of Santa Claus came from St. Nicholas, but the real saint wasn't a bearded man who wore a red suit and had a long, white beard. That all came much later. According to legend, the fourth-century Christian bishop gave away his abundant inheritance to help the needy and rescued women from servitude. As the tale made the rounds, his name became Sinter Klaas in Dutch. That later morphed into Santa Claus, and the rest of the trappings followed.

coca-cola and santa's IMAGE. Craving a Coke yet? Give it a second. According to Coca-Cola, Santa used to look a lot less jolly — even spooky. Go ahead, Google early images of Santa. It wasn't until the beverage company hired an illustrator named Haddon Sundblom in 1931 to create images of Santa for magazine advertisements that we got the warm and friendly Santa we know today. Now, kids wouldn't fear interrupting Santa's nightly work.

CELEBRATING CHRISTMAS USED TO BE ILLEGAL.

By the time the Puritans settled Boston, celebrating Christmas was outlawed. Talk about missing the Christmas spirit! From 1659 to 1681, anyone caught making merry would face a fine for celebrating the once-pagan day. And after the Revolutionary War, the new Congress found the

day so unimportant that they even held the first session on December 25, 1789. Christmas wasn't proclaimed a federal holiday for nearly another century, proving that the Grinch's notorious hatred of the holiday was alive and well long before he was.





PUT BOOKS IN THE HANDS OF CHILDREN WHO NEED THEM


