MONDAY JULY 15 at 1:00 PM. Coordinator: Patricia Ackah. This month's book "**Magdalen Girls**" by **V.S. Alexander**. *Dublin, 1962*. Within the gated grounds of the convent of The Sisters of the Holy Redemption lies one of the city's Magdalen Laundries. Once places of refuge, the laundries have evolved into grim workhouses. Some inmates are "fallen" women—unwed mothers, prostitutes, or petty criminals. Most are ordinary girls whose only sin lies in being too pretty, too independent, or tempting the wrong man. Among them is sixteen-year-old Teagan Tiernan, sent by her family when her beauty provokes a lustful revelation from a young priest. Teagan soon befriends Nora Craven, a new arrival who thought nothing could be worse than living in a squalid tenement flat. Stripped of their freedom and dignity, the girls are given new names and denied contact with the outside world.

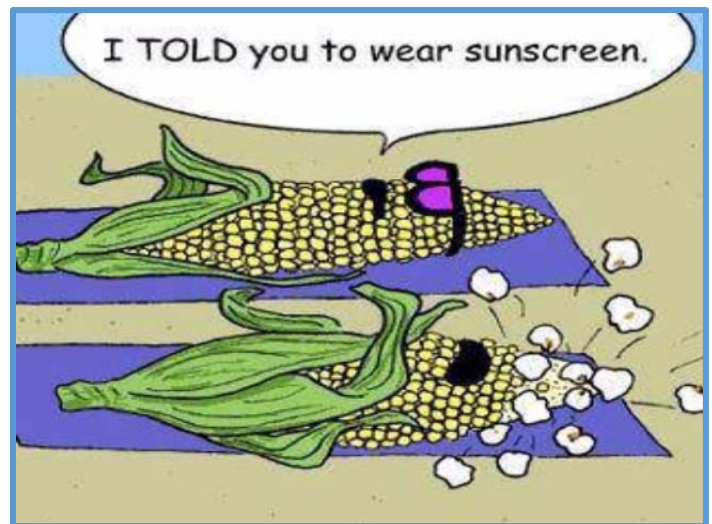

To the Residents of Upper Merion Township:

Your Upper Merion Township Fire & EMS Department was so please to address our senior citizens this week. We met on June 13th at the meeting where we introduced our staff of the new Upper Merion Public Safety Department. We then had a candid conversation about the upcoming changes of the new Fire and Emergency Medical Services (EMS) department. This included the dissolution of Lafayette Ambulance & Rescue Squad, the new subscription services of Upper Merion Fire and EMS, and our free smoke alarm installation program.

It is an exciting time to be living in the Upper Merion Township however, important steps were taken to maintain accountability and service to its' community members. In May 2019, Lafayette Ambulance dissolved and the ambulance service in Upper Merion is now being provided by the Upper Merion Township. Therefore, the Upper Merion Township created a new Public Safety Department headed by Police Chief Thomas Nolan. Due to this new expansion of services, the Township has hired sixteen new paramedics and emergency medical technicians to provide Advanced Life Support (ALS) care.

The Township has adopted the same subscription service that Lafayette Ambulance has used over the years. The subscription service is continuing to provide residents the same billing reduction program as Lafayette. This program is aimed to reduce the cost of ambulance use for the subscription holders, and to help defer related operational costs. **The new subscription service overview form is tentatively planned to arrive at your door step, by US Mail, on July 1st 2019.**

In addition to providing EMS services the Township will be sponsoring many life safety and fire prevention initiatives. **On August 24th 2019, the Public Safety Department will be walking door to door of homes and businesses in the King of Prussia area checking and installing smoke alarm in cooperation with the American Red Cross. Another avenue to obtain this life saving device installed in your home is to call our Smoke Alarm Hotline at (484)-636-3945. Please just follow the directions and provide the requested information.**

We want to thank you for allowing the Upper Merion Township Public Safety Department to meet you at the Senior Service Center. Let us close our comments by extending a tremendous **thank you** to Lafayette Ambulance for its' many years of helping the community with their amazing services. Finally, we want to acknowledge and thank the senior citizens and the rest of the community for making this Township a great place to live and work. As I said it is an exciting time to live in Upper Merion Township! We look forward to serving the citizens and visitors of Upper Merion, please be safe out there!

KNITTED CAPS FOR ST. CHRISTOPHER'S

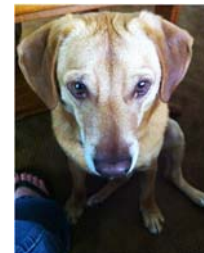
