If anyone knows of vendors or crafters who would like to have a table, please have them contact the Center for more information. The



it look better and make it easier to find things. No special organizer needed. As shown in the photo you can use little bowls and/or small plates that you already have to separate items such as




stamps, rubber bands, batteries, etc. Use a non-slip drawer liner to keep the bowls in place and voila', you have an organized junk drawer!


