IT'S SOUP WEATHER!
TURKEY & VEGETABLE BARLEY SOUP

THIS RECIPE IS A GREAT WAY TO USE YOUR LEFTOVER TURKEY.

- 1 TBSP CANOLA OIL
- 5 MEDIUM CARROTS, CHOPPED
- 1 MEDIUM ONION, CHOPPED
- 1/3 CUP QUICK-COOKING BARLEY
- 6 CUPS REDUCED-SODIUM CHICKEN BROTH
- 2 CUPS CUBED COOKED TURKEY BREAST
- 2 CUPS FRESH BABY SPINACH
- ½ TSP PEPPER



1. IN A LARGE SAUCEPAN, HEAT OIL OVER MEDIUM-HIGH HEAT. ADD CARROTS & ONION; COOK & STIR UNTIL CARROTS ARE CRISP-TENDER, 4-5 MINUTES.

2. STIR IN BARLEY & BROTH; BRING TO A BOIL. REDUCE HEAT; SIMMER, COVERED, UNTIL CARROTS AND BARLEY ARE TENDER, 10-15 MINUTES. STIR IN TURKEY, SPINACH & PEPPER; HEAT THROUGH.

OPTIONAL: YOU CAN ADD MORE VEGGIES TO THE SOUP IF YOU LIKE. JUST ADD SOME CORN, BEANS OR CELERY.

 YIELD: 6 SERVINGS (2 QUARTS)

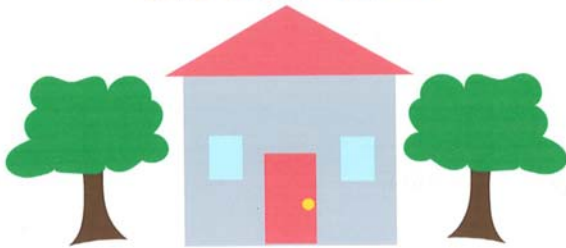

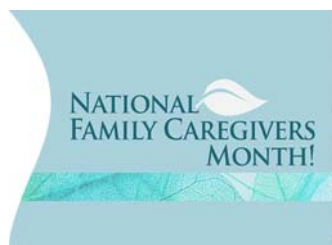

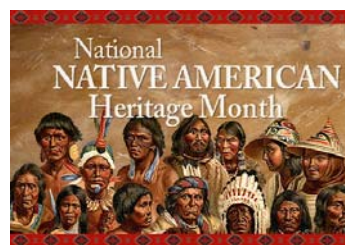
