

TRICENTENNIAL SPEAKER SERIES

Sunday, May 5 at 2:00 P.M. at the Township Building - Freedom Hall: *Schuylkill Valley Heritage* – what happened along the river and why it was so important to the local economy?

Ecumenical Service Sunday, May 5 at 7:00 P.M. at Mother of Divine Providence Church: Join us in celebrating the religious and ethnic history and diversity of Upper Merion. A reception will follow in the church hall.

Civil War History Day: Saturday, June 29 from 10:00am to 3:00pm - Old Swedes Church
Why a Civil War History Day at Old Swedes Church? Within the stone walls of the centuries-old cemetery at Old Swedes Church lie the graves of many early and prominent area citizens, many of whom served in the Civil War – including Anna Holstein and Sarah Priest, two women who selflessly served the sick, injured and dying during the Civil War. “Meet” Anna Holstein and other re-enactors. Learn about Civil War life & times, and what it was like to serve as a Civil War nurse. Visit the church, built in 1760, and learn of its interesting and valuable history and architecture.

FRIENDS OF VALLEY FORGE PARK SPEAKER SERIES

The annual Speaker Series is held in cooperation with the Washington Memorial Chapel. Programs are held on the first Tuesday of the month at 7 pm. The following program will be held **at the Visitor Center Theater.**

Tuesday, May 7: *Eighteenth Century Documents* presented by Tom Lingenfelter, a dealer in rare historical documents and artifacts. Mr. Lingenfelter shares the fascinating stories behind some of his American treasures, including an important anastatic copy of the Declaration of Independence. Anastatic printing is defined as “a form of facsimile reproduction invented and developed in Germany in the early 1840s

and subsequently in England.” Lingenfelter believes the anastatic process radically accelerated the deterioration of the original engrossed Declaration now at the National Archives in Washington DC.

“Those who go to see the engrossed copy at the National Archives are shocked that it is barely visible. Its pale brown text on off-white parchment is nearly impossible to read,” Lingenfelter said. “The Anastatic Declaration is a facsimile from a plate produced by a chemical transfer process that nearly destroyed the original engrossed Declaration.” *Several of Mr. Lingenfelter's historical documents will be on display at the May 7th talk.*
